With 16p prospectus in printed paper wrappers. A near fine copy of this handsomely printed edition of Eliot's celebrated *Four Quartets*. It is copy number 172 of a limited edition of 200 printed in the Hunt Roman type, which was designed by Hermann Zapf in 1962, on Lana 1590 Edition paper. The Rampant Lions Press was founded in 1924 by Will Carter (1912-2001) and it ran successfully from then until the workshop closed in 2008. In the 1960s he was joined by his son, Sebastian Carter (b.1941) - who designed and printed this book. The success of the press was such that it was known worldwide for its design skills and craftmanship, which can certainly be seen in the production of this volume.


